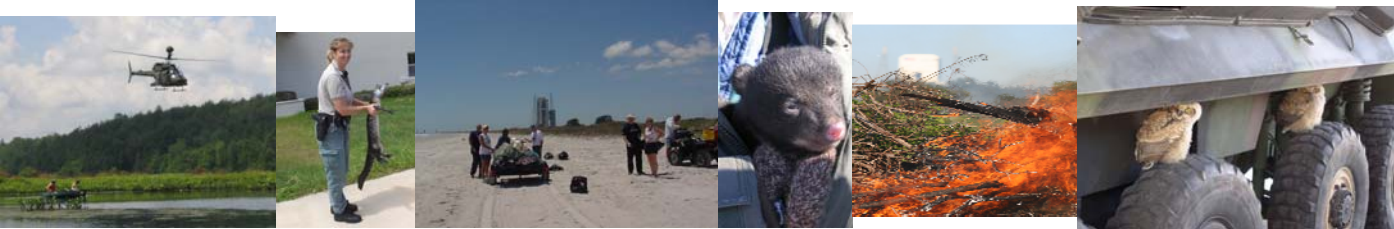

The **National Military Fish and Wildlife Association (NMFWA)** was officially chartered in 1983 by a small group of dedicated Department of Defense (DoD) resource management professionals. NMFWA, which can trace its roots of organized involvement back to 1977, is a non-profit organization consisting of professional resource managers working to protect and manage wildlife and other natural resources on DoD lands.



The primary purpose of DoD lands is for training the Army, Navy, Air Force and Marines. Yet these lands, are found throughout the United States and territories, are some of the most biologically diverse federal lands in the nation.



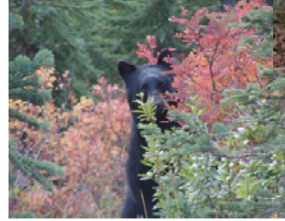
