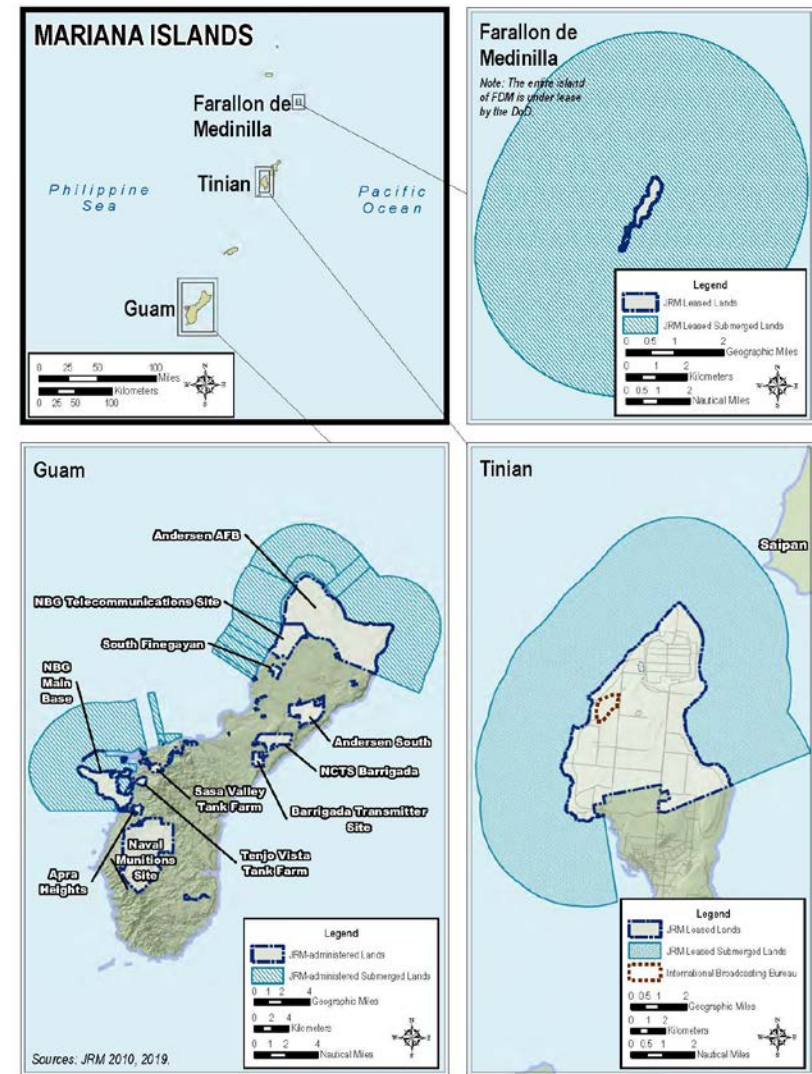

Key Programs

- Biosecurity / Invasive species management
 - Brown treesnake control/interdiction
 - Coconut rhinoceros beetle control/interdiction
 - Little Fire Ant (LFA) control/interdiction
- Marine resources management
 - Monitor coral bleaching events
- Forest enhancement
 - Ungulate fencing and control
 - Non-native species removal
 - Native species outplantings
 - Listed species protection



Highlights/Recent Accomplishments

- Increased partnerships with Federal and Territorial resource agencies
- Fine tuning of operational land-scape level control of brown treesnakes
 - Aerial delivery of toxicants
- Extensive use of Cooperative Agreements to execute natural resources projects
 - Exploration of Grants

Lessons Learned/Shared

- Open communication and active listening with Resource Partners to achieve goals
- Creative cooperative agreements to improve partnerships
- Proactive management of listed species to improve collaborative partnerships



How NAVFACMAR Support Missions

- Sea turtle nesting habitat monitoring enable Special Operations seashore training
- Brown treesnake interdiction/control implemented on multiple islands to support large-scale DON, USMC and USAF exercises
- Listed species surveys on JRM lands support delisting initiatives by providing USFWS improved status information. Delisting of species will reduce regulatory burden to support multiple missions
- Feral pig removal to reduce native forest degradation and protect warfighter families
